TEXTS: ROMANS 5:12-21

THE RECAP: (10 MINUTES)

In week 12 of the Romans series Pastor Joby showed us how the Apostle Paul is talking about the depth of our sin and the abundance of God's grace in Romans 5. We are not bad, but dead in own sin. Sin is not just an action but a heart condition. It rules our life like an evil dictator and the only cure for sin is the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The Gospel is God's plan and His beauty displayed for us to see.

THE POINT: OUR SIN IS LIKE A HEREDITARY DISEASE THAT AFFECTS AND INFECTS EVERY ONE OF US. THE GOOD NEWS OF THE GOSPEL OF JESUS CHRIST IS THAT HE IS THE CURE FOR ANYONE WHO WOULD BELIEVE.

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TEACHING & DIALOGUE

Have someone read Romans 5:12-14 out loud.

In Romans 5:8 we see that the Gospel is motivated by God's love thus making the Gospel not just practical but also beautiful. The Apostle Paul wants to clarify that God did not just perform a legal transaction but loved so much that He saved. Paul continues in Romans 5 to flesh out what exactly God saved us from.

The Apostle Paul accepts Genesis 3 as true and as the foundation of all mankind's sin. Adam is responsible for sin entering into the world because he disobeyed God in full knowledge (1 Timothy 2:14.) Sin results in death and the evidence of every human's death shows that sin did not stop with Adam but has spread to every person (Psalm 51:5). Sin is a hereditary spiritual condition.¹

- What comes to your mind when you hear the word "sin"? How does this line up with what the Bible says sin is? (Genesis 3, Jeremiah 17:9, 1 John 2:15-17, James 1:13-15)
- 2. How do you see the effects of sin play out in the world around you? (death, hate, violence, self-glorification, etc)
- 3. How do you see the effects of your own sin in your life? (your desire to be right, your hunger for self-gratification, your anxiety, your unforgiveness.)

Read this description of sin:

Sin is the Glory of God not honored,
The holiness of God not reverenced.
The greatness of God not admired.
The power of God not praised.
The truth of God not sought.
The wisdom of God not esteemed.
The beauty of God not treasured.
The goodness of God not savored.
The promises of God not believed.
The commandments of God not obeyed.
The justice of God not respected.
The wrath of God not feared.
The grace of God not cherished.
The presence of God not prized.
The presence of God not loved

Have someone read Romans 5:15-17 out loud.

As death entered through Adam God has given the free gift of grace through Jesus. This free gift is different than the trespass because we all earned the trespass and did not earn the free gift. We are active in the trespass and just receive the gift, and the trespass infects all of mankind while the free gift is only applied to those who receive it.

- 4. What does verse 17 tell us about God's character as we read that the free gift includes the ABUNDANCE of grace?
 (God does not give the bare minimum but lavishes us with grace upon grace ~1 John 3:1. He does not change His mind and take back the free gift of salvation.)
- 5. How have you experienced God's ABUNDANT grace in your life? (Be as specific as possible with your example.)


Have someone read Romans 5:18-21 out loud.

Just as ALL are condemned by their own sin, ALL are invited to receive the most costly gift. The price has already been paid through the blood of Christ and God saves all those who will receive the gift.

6. How have you already meditated on the implications of the Gospel in your own life this week? How can you be reminded to do so on a daily basis? (Scripture reminders, daily devotional, intentional prayer time, Gospel centered conversations with friends/mentors.)
