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These 3 Remain- WEEK 1: Legacy of Faith

THE POINT: The object of our faith is more important than the size of our faith.

SERMON TEXTS: Hebrews 11-12:2, Romans 4

Discussion Questions

(The goal is to grow in our relationship with Christ and each other. It is ok if you don't cover every question).

DISCOVER

Have someone read Hebrews 11:1-10 out loud.

1. Faith was never intended to just be a "noun" (pistis) in our lives but rather a "verb" (pisteuo). What does that mean? *(Faith is not an event we experience but an identity we take on in life. It isn't a one-time thing but an ongoing lifestyle that is reflective of a living, active relationship with Jesus. Faith leads to obedience. It is not the other way around).*
2. What is the difference between having faith in self/circumstances/other people and having faith in Jesus? *(Faith in self/circumstances is mere religion, going through the motions and checking the boxes off. Having faith in Jesus is a relationship and it's personal, intimate and growing in nature. Placing faith in anything else before Christ means we bring God leftovers. Leftover time, leftover relationship and leftover finances).*
3. How would you describe your faith right now? Are you truly living by faith in Jesus through a Holy Spirit-enabled, joyful, clinging to Jesus? Or is it more about rule keeping, morality, comfort, your education, your strength/power or your family? *(Answers will vary).*

OPTIONAL: Have one or two people read Romans 4 out loud.

4. How is Abraham an example of great faith? What in his life reflected this? *(Abraham believed God. He specifically believed that God would indeed make him a father, even in his old age and that of his wife. He did not give up hope even though with each passing day, the chances seemed MORE than improbable. It seemed impossible).*

DEEPEN

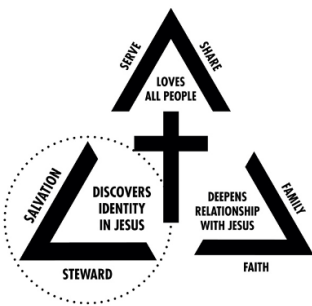
Read Hebrews 11:11, 20-40 and Hebrews 12:1-2 out loud.

5. By faith, Sarah received power to conceive. Where do you need the power of God in your life right now? What seems improbable, maybe even impossible, without it? *(Answers will vary).*

6. Faith requires our repentance, our perseverance (taking our next step of faith) and fixing our eyes on Jesus. Of these three, which one is most needed in your life right now? Why? *(Answers will vary).*

ACTION STEP

What is your next step of faith? Sit in the presence of God this week, pray and cling to Jesus while listening for this next step. If you already know the next step, sit and cling to Jesus while He reminds you of His promises, commands and love! Examples of next steps could be: Repenting and placing your faith in Christ. Getting baptized. Attending every day of Saturated. Sharing your faith more openly with family, friends or co-workers. Lovingly confronting a friend over their poor choices. Breaking free from a habit that is harmful.
