The Gospel According to John – The Woman at the Well

The Point: The fake you is doing just fine. But the real Jesus died on a real cross for the real you. SERMON TEXTS: John 4:1-45

Discussion Questions

DISCOVER

Have someone read John 4:1-9.

1. What do we learn about Jesus' divine nature in these passages? What does His nature mean for us? (Jesus is fully God and fully human. He got tired, weary, hungry and thirsty; therefore, He understands every one of our temptations, pains and desires. Being fully God means Jesus never sinned in the midst of all the temptations.)

2. How is Jesus modeling the life and behaviors he wants for His followers by passing through Samaria, rather than going around? What or who is your "Samaria"? (Jews and Samaritans had a long history of hatred toward each other. We might not say we hate a person or group of people, but when we purposefully avoid, ignore or discount, we can rest assured we are not acting in love towards them.)

Have someone read John 4:10-26.

3. Here we see Jesus questioning much of this woman's life and the things she is pursuing. What would Jesus call into question in your life? Where are you seeking satisfaction and security outside of Him? (There are three buckets of sin, the lust of the eyes, lust of the flesh and the pride of life. Nothing that we pursue in this world will ever fully and finally satisfy. Pastor Joby calls this the "cul-desac of stupidity." Our insatiable soul can only be satisfied in the everlasting God because we are image bearers of Him.)

4. What does it mean to worship God in both spirit and truth? Why is it necessary for us to worship God in both truth and spirit? (Believing is great, but we have been created to worship! Our wounds are real, but Jesus wants us to be defined by His wounds, not our wounds. We need to embrace the things that stir our affections for the Lord, so that we will worship Him with all of our lives.)

DEEPEN

Have someone read John 4:27-45.


5. A disciple discovers their identity is Jesus Christ alone, believing salvation is found in Him alone. What do you to need to surrender over to and leave with Jesus? (Answers may vary.)

6. A disciple loves all people through sharing the gospel, which could be through either word or action. Where do you have an opportunity to share the gospel on most days of your life? Where could you share the gospel? (Answers may vary.)

ACTION STEPS
