# The Gospel According to John – The Word Became Flesh

**The Point:** The Son of God became a man so that men and women could become children of God.

SERMON TEXTS: John 1:1-18

## Discussion Questions

Let's discover how God's Word is always showing us His goodness, and our great need for Him! Have someone read John 1:1-11 and another person read Colossians 1:15-20.

#### **DISCOVER**

- 1. What do we learn about the Word of God in these verses? How are we to view God's Word as a response? (They are one and the same. The Word IS God, Jesus being the Word made flesh. He is the Living, Eternal Word. The Word is authoritative and perfect just as much as Jesus.)
- 2. It's easy to think about Jesus, the man, that first comes on the scene at the time of the gospels, but what do we learn about Him through these verses? (Jesus was active from "the beginning." He began the beginning; He started the start. He had a role in the creation of all things.)
- **3. What are the descriptive terms used in these verses that characterize Jesus?** (Jesus is the Word, He is God, in Him was life, the light, received not by His own, full of grace and truth, the One and Only, He came from the Father.)
- **4. What darkness do you experience, in the world, and your own life?** (Answers may vary Please lean into general answers and ask for people to tell you more.)


# **DEEPEN**

Ask one person to read John 1:12-18 out loud.

- **5.** Jesus came full of grace and truth. What does that mean? How is the Biblical truth and grace different than a worldly truth and grace? (Saving faith is by the grace of God and in keeping with the truth of God, meaning we cannot work our way to Heaven, nor can we make up our own "truth" that will gain us entry. Just because we don't believe parts of the Bible or God's truth doesn't negate the fact that we will still be held accountable to it. Man cannot try to make up their own way to the Father.)
- 6. Through Jesus, God did more than forgive you. He adopted you, making you a son or daughter of the most High King! Are you living like a child of God? (The opposite of an adopted son/daughter is an orphan. Orphans do not have a father to look to for guidance, love, discipline and protection.)

# **ACTION STEP**

Are you a child of God? Get with a partner in your Disciple Group and practice sharing your testimony in a brief manner. Describe what your life was like before you surrendered to Christ, how you came to faith and what your life is like after committing to Jesus. Try to keep it around 3-4 minutes in length.
