The Gospel According to John – Come and See

The Point: Who are you inviting to "come and see" Jesus for themselves? Who is your one more?

SERMON TEXTS: John 1:35-51

Discussion Questions

Have someone read John 1:35-51

DISCOVER

- 1. What do you think it was like to spend the night with Jesus? What would you ask him? (Answers will vary.)
- 2. Why did Jesus asks the two disciples, "What are you seeking?" What is your answer to Jesus' question, "What are you seeking?" (Answers may vary press in on specifics regarding work, family, church, this disciple group, and following Jesus.)
- **3.** What does Jesus invite Andrew, Simon Peter, Philip, Andrew, and us to do? What does this invitation mean? (Follow me! The greatest invitation from the greatest Man ever! Remember these men call Jesus, "Rabbi," at the outset. Ordinary men, being invited to "follow" a Rabbi. Jesus meets us right where we are, with no pre-conditions, but just to follow Jesus... taking one step at a time.)
- 4. What can we learn from Andrew in this story? If you were to leave right now and go tell a friend or a loved one about your encounter with Jesus, what would you tell them? (The two disciples immediately referred to Jesus as, "Rabbi." One, named Andrew, left the next morning to find his brother, Peter. After one evening with Jesus, he told Peter, "We have found the Messiah." And then he brought Peter to Jesus.)

DEEPEN

Ask one person to read John 1:43-51 out loud.


- 5. Verse 43 says that Jesus, "Found Philip," and verse 45 says, "Philip found Nathanael." What did you learn about sharing your faith with the people in your life? (Answers will vary Many ways to share faith: Pray for opportunity, share an invitation, share link, share your story, share what you learned at worship service/sermon, share a cup of coffee.)
- 6. We see in verses 44-46, Nathanael had some doubts about Philip's message that Jesus was the fulfillment of prophecies, and the Christ. What doubts do you have or hear from your friends and family? How might you model Philip's response to those objections? (Philip doesn't argue or explain all of the past prophecies, he simply says, "Come and see." Know that you are beheld by God. Jesus sees you and sees in you what you cannot see. Jesus can see the redeemed version of you.)

ACTION STEP

Identify your one more. A real invitation is specific. If the Holy Spirit is calling someone, it does not matter if they like you or if you have the perfect words. Trust that God is bigger than your personality or communication. Share with the group and then write their name on page 17 of your John journal. Partner up with someone in your group and pray for each other's #onemores and pray for an opportunity to invite ("Come and see") them to join you at a worship experience next week.

*Leaders – capture the #onemores from your group and share them with the group this week. Ask the group to be praying for each other's #onemores!
