The Gospel According to John – Anger Management

THE POINT: Exploitation in the name of religion angers God. He did not come to take from his people, but to give his life for them.

SERMON TEXTS: John 2:13-25

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

DISCOVER

Have someone read John 2:13-25

- 1. What do you think about when you think about Jesus? How are you growing in the way you think about Jesus? (Answers may vary Leaders lean into how everyone is growing in their relationship with the Lord.)
- 2. What is the problem at the temple? How would you summarize the heart of the problem? (Jesus saw how His people were being exploited by the very system that was supposed to point people to the sacrificial Savior. Similar to a Coke at Disney for \$12.)
- 3. How is Jesus displaying righteous anger? What is the difference in righteous and unrighteous anger? (Are we upset because our soul hungers and thirst for righteousness (Mt 5:6) or because we are personally offended or inconvenienced (James 4:1)? Anger does not happen to us, but through us.)
- **4.** How were the Gentiles being pushed out of the temple? How is this like unbelievers being "pushed" out of the church today? (In Romans, Paul points out several times that all true believers are considered God's chosen people. Gentiles could be viewed as our #onemores, today. Therefore, anything we do that keeps our #onemores from coming to Christ, angers Him.)

DEEPEN

- 5. Jesus wants to remove all obstacles from the relationship He desires to have with you. What part of your life are you trying to control and need to surrender to Him? (Answers may vary)
- 6. What do suppose happens in your soul and your relationship with Jesus when you have righteous anger and do nothing about it? (We are often afraid of the consequences of taking bold faith actions but fail to consider the impact to our soul when we don't take action.)

ACTION STEPS


This week in your quiet time consider all the things that make you angry, both righteous and unrighteous, and write them down. Ask God to show you things that make you angry which you may not have considered before.

1. After writing your list pray through them, asking God to show you which items:

- Reveal the kingdom of you (unrighteous)?
- Reveal anger for God's kingdom and others (righteous)?

2. Take a step on your Discipleship Journey.

- Surrender your unrighteous anger and discover your identity is in Jesus and not your circumstances.
- Step towards the righteous anger by taking a step towards loving all people. Find a local partner that you can serve alongside that is fighting injustice and exploitation here in NE Florida. **Visit coe22.com/localoutreach.**
