Preach! – Prodigal Son

The Point: The story of the prodigal son is a picture of what God the Father did for us through Jesus Christ, He embraced us.

SERMON TEXTS: Luke 15:11-24, Deuteronomy 21:18-21

Discussion Questions

DISCOVER

Have someone read Luke 15:11--24

- 1. How are the first three verses of this passage a lesson on stewardship: use of our time, talent and treasure?** *(The younger son is given everything the father has for him, which is similar to the blessings that God gives each one of us. Both believers and nonbelievers have time, talent and treasure to either use for God's kingdom or our own kingdom.)*
- 2. What is tempting the younger son to demand his inheritance now?** *(The specific "what" is somewhat subjective in these verses, but we can be sure that there is a "what." Something that is calling or tempting the younger son to demand his inheritance from his living father. Temptation leads all people to desire and demand things we think we deserve.)*
- 3. What does Jesus want us to know through God's intervention and the son's response?** *(This is a picture of salvation for every believer. God brings us to our senses and opens our eyes to the depth of our sin. At this point we see ourselves and everything around us differently. We get to repent from current bondage in sin and be reconciled with the Father, who clothes us in His robe of righteousness, gives us a ring of sonship and invites us to the feast with Him.)*
- 4. What three points did Pastor Josh make about the father in this parable and what does it teach us about God the Father?** *(1. He was waiting – God is always waiting for us to return to Him with his eyes fixed on the horizon. 2. He was running – the father took on a shameful and undignified act for those days. 3. He was embracing – the father embraced and covered his son, so that no one would be able to harm him; it would be indistinguishable where the father ended, and the son started.)*

DEEPEN

Eleven22 is focusing on the word **Relationship** from our vision statement during this year. Disciple groups offer one way to live out what it means to be a disciple through discovering an identity in Jesus as Lord; surrendering our entire lives to Him.

Have someone read Luke 15:25--32

- 5. Which son do you feel like in this moment and why?** *(Answers may vary. Try to name at least one specific reason you feel like one son or the other.)*
- 6. How is God calling you back to Himself? Is it to let go of a pattern of sinful living or is it to let go of a self-righteous, superiority mindset?** *(Answers may vary.)*

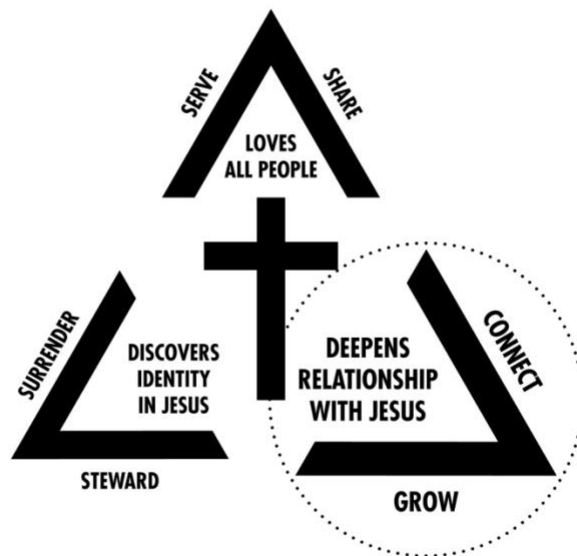
ACTION STEPS
