The Point: You weren't set free from the fight. You were set free for the fight.

SERMON TEXT: James 1:14-18

Discussion Questions

DISCOVER

Have someone read James 1:1

1. Why is James writing to the "twelve tribes in the Dispersion" and why is this significant for us today? (Initially hearing "twelve tribes" you may think of Jacob's twelve sons, which is true. James is most likely also referring to God's people as a whole, as a way to present the fullness of God's people. Jesus begins His ministry by choosing twelve disciples, clearly pointing back to the twelve tribes of Israel; again, showing that God's plan includes ALL people due to the diversity found in Jesus's selection of disciples. The Dispersion is reminding us that God's people have been persecuted in the past, at times driven out of their homes and country, which we continue to see and experience today.)

Have someone read James 1:2-18

2. How are trials and troubling times an opportunity for joy? (Trials and troubles are not joyful, but they do play a vital part on our path to joy. Joy is like love in that true love is an action that can be a great sacrifice to ourselves no matter how we feel about it. Similarly, true joy is found when we "count," or decide, that our trial is a source of joy, rather than allowing the trial to overcome us.)

3. What is the difference in being tested and being tempted? Where have you experienced both in your life? (God allows us to be tested in order to refine us, bring out impurities and produce a clearer image of Himself in his image bearers. Think of it as sanctification. Tempting is NOT from God, because tempting draws us away from God. Testing reveals more of Him in us.)

4. If you decided today, that for the rest of your life your only goal was to grow in holiness, what would need to change? (Answers may vary – remember "holiness" simply means to be set apart. If you don't know where to start, start by asking God.)

DEEPEN

Eleven22 is focusing on the word **Relationship** from our vision statement during this year. Disciple groups offer one way to live out what it means to be a disciple through discovering an identity in Jesus as Lord; surrendering our entire lives to Him.

Have someone read 2 Timothy 2:21-27

5. Do you know Satan's strategy against you? What tries to lure you away from Christ most often? (Answers may vary.)

6. Do you know what stirs your affections for Christ and do you have an accountability partner who can point you back to Him? (Answers may vary.)

<u>ACTION STEPS</u>

A Disciple...Loves All People, Discovers Identity in Jesus, Deepens Relationship with Jesus.

Leader: Tonight, we're going to return to the Father together and then celebrate by taking communion.
