The Point: Are you ready to "come to your senses" and come home to your heavenly Father?

SERMON TEXT: Luke 15:11-32; 1 John 2:15-17; John 3:16-17

Discussion Questions

DISCOVER (If you use the video curriculum, play the first part before you discuss the discover questions.)

LEADERS – Every week we're asking you to begin with these two questions. It's a great way to get the conversation started.

- What stood out to you from the sermon this week?
- What did God reveal to you in any of the scriptures this week, maybe for the first time?

DEEPEN (If you use the video curriculum, play the second part before you discuss the deepen questions.)

Read Luke 15:11-32

- One of the most important reasons we read the Bible is to learn more about who God is and about God's character. Share all the character traits of our Heavenly Father you see in The Prodigal Son parable. Hint: there are many. (God is loving, forgiving, willing to humiliate himself to save you. He loves you enough to allow you to fall down so your only option is to look up to Him, but He is willing to meet you where you are. God loves you enough to give you free will, but He always watching and waiting for YOU to turn to Him, and heaven celebrates when you return to him. The Father won't enable your sinful behavior. He desires a relationship with you, has compassion for you, is Grace-filled, and willing to beg you to repent and receive Him even when you don't fully understand Him. God is protective of you.)
- The rebellion of the younger son and the religion of the older son separated them from the love of the father. Is your rebellion or religion (or sometimes both) creating distance between you and Jesus, and how does that show up in your thoughts and behavior? (We need to be aware of our sin before we can repent and surrender it to Jesus. Rebellion always feels like fun and freedom at first, but only leads to bondage and death. The lure of sin will bait you down a road you never wanted to go down, cost you more than you can pay, keep you longer than you wanted to stay, and hurt you far worse than you ever dreamed, every single time. Religion can lead to pride, selfishness, self-righteousness, envy and a lack of compassion. The answer to both is repentance. Turn your back on sin and return to your loving, forgiving Father.)
- Jesus changes an old parable that ends with the rebellious son being stoned to one that ends with the son being forgiven, received back into the family and covered with kisses from his father. Have YOU experienced the kiss of the father? Can you articulate what that feels like and share it with the group? (Jesus took a story about an "honor killing" and turned it into a story of Grace and salvation through His love. We are not primarily servants to a master but sons and daughters to a Father. Sons and daughters work from a different motivation relationship.)

ACTION STEP

A Disciple...Loves All People, Discovers Identity in Jesus, Deepens Relationship with Jesus.


- 1. Read Luke 15:11-32 again and meditate on all the ways the parable shows God's love for YOU, specifically.
- 2. Journal how God's love makes you feel and respond as the Spirit leads you.
