Stand Alone – Praying with Jesus

The Point: Prayer is a natural response to the Gospel.

SERMON TEXT: Matthew 6:1-15

Discussion Questions

DISCOVER

Have someone read Matthew 6:1-15

1. What do Jesus's words teach us about prayer in these verses? (Prayer is meant as a first response, not a last resort. Prayer is how we communicate and connect with God, seeking the presence of God. These verses teach us how Jesus wants us to think about prayer.)

2. Why did Jesus spend time teaching how NOT to pray before sharing his model on how to pray? Why are these verses relevant today? (Self-righteousness prohibits prayer and is a foolish attempt to impress God. Focusing on those listening to us as we pray over focusing on the ONE we're praying to prevents us from connecting with God. Pastor Cam compared praying like a hypocrite, or gentile, to being an imposter.)

3. How do you know if you're praying to manipulate God for a blessing or to know God as THE Blessing? When have you found yourself praying like the hypocrites Jesus is warning us about? (Jesus says the hypocrite is one who doesn't have passion to know God. They might be "religious" in order to get something, when in actuality the greatest thing we can receive through prayer is MORE God.)

4. Why are verses 9-15 the model for prayer? (For one Jesus is teaching it, but most importantly it's the posture of deep dependence on our creator over self.)

DEEPEN

In light of what we have discovered through God's word and discussed above, let's go deeper and discuss how God's word applies to us and our lives.

Have someone read Matthew 6:9-15 and Daniel 9:18

5. What is the focus of your prayer time? Is it rooted in a sense of dependence or a sense of duty? (Answers may vary.)

6. How do you prioritize prayer time and what do you do when you are tight on time? (Dependence is fueled by grace. Duty is fueled by fear. You will either live in fear or in despair if God's favor is only your duty. God doesn't want you to pray because you fear that He will cut off your allowance, but because you desire to hear from a loving Father.)

<u>ACTION STEP</u>

A Disciple...Loves All People, Discovers Identity in Jesus, Deepens Relationship with Jesus.


This Week: Pastor Cam shared that it was uncommon to meditate on God as "Our father" when Matthew 6 was written. But the throne of grace is inviting us make prayer a lifestyle, to spend time with "our father," who loves us! **Take a Next Step:** Worship God through your prayer life this week by returning to the Father using Matthew 6:9-15 (the Lord's Prayer) and Daniel 9:18 as a guide.

- Try reading one verse at a time and reflect on what that verse means.
 - Allow each verse to prompt you into a deeper conversation with the Lord using A.C.T.S.:
 - Adoration Tell God all of the things you adore about Him, who is your God.
 - Confession Tell God all of the sin in your life.
 - Thanksgiving Tell God what you are thankful for in your life.
 - Supplication Pray for your needs, as well as the needs of others (your community, city, state & country).
