Psalms - Week 13: A New Song

The Point: "Oh sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done marvelous things! His right hand and his holy arm have worked salvation for him." - Psalm 98:1

SERMON TEXT: Psalm 98, John 4:23, Luke 7:36-50, Matthew 26:13

Discussion Questions

DISCOVER

LEADERS: Ask someone to read Psalm 98 and use the questions as a guide for discussion.

- What are the instructions in Psalm 98 on HOW to worship? (This psalm invites us to join our voices with all of creation to praise God for all of His acts of salvation. Verse four tells us, "Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth; break forth into joyous song and sing praises." How does God expect praises from "all the earth"? In vv. 5-6, He tells us to "sing praises to the Lord with the sound of melody and instruments, and make a joyful noise before the King, the Lord!" In vv. 7-8, He says, "let the sea roar, and all that fills it; the world and those who dwell in it! Let the rivers clap their hands; let the hills sing for joy together...")
- How does the Bible define worship and why does God command us to worship? (Worship means to ascribe worth to something. Worship is more than singing, but it is not less. People have an instinct to sing to express deep emotions, learn new things and connect with others in their community. Singing, and other arts like dancing or making music, are a gift from God because it gives us a way to express what is in our souls that we cannot express in other ways. God is worthy of our worship because of His perfect character, holiness and goodness. We were created to worship. Consider: 1. The marvelous things God has done. 2. The victory has been won. 3. God has already fulfilled past prophecies and promises and will do it again. We become what/who we worship.
- What does it mean to "sing a new song"? (Pastor Joby taught us that the "new song" the psalmist writes about is associated with a victory that God has won for His people. The Israelites would sing a song to God in faith that they would win in battle, and after they won they would sing the same song again as a fulfillment of their faith in God and gratitude for His promises. A new song doesn't have to be a new tune, but rather singing a familiar song with a fresh faith.
- Where in your life has God won a victory for you and how did you respond?

DEEPEN

Let's go deeper into God's word and discuss how we can apply these truths to our lives!

Ask someone to read Luke 7:36-50 and Matthew 26:13

- In Luke 7 a sinful woman poured out her heart and her money to honor and worship Jesus. The religious Pharisee was offended and prideful. When you come to church/corporate worship—which of the two are you? When have you worshipped like the woman and when have you acted like the Pharisees?
- Because we all worship something, what competes with your worship of Jesus?
- What stops you from worshipping the way God commands?
- What stirs your affections for Jesus and how often are they stirred?

ACTION STEP

A Disciple...Loves All People, Discovers Identity in Jesus, Deepens Relationship with Jesus.

Leader Read: Pastor Joby said that we all live somewhere between gratitude and entitlement. A gratitude list is one way to humble ourselves by acknowledging ALL the blessings our Heavenly Father has given us.


This Week:
