# Psalms - Week 15: Better Than Life

The Point: "So I have looked upon you in the sanctuary, beholding your power and glory. Because your steadfast love is better than life, my lips will praise you." - Psalm 63:2-3

SERMON TEXT: Psalm 63, 2 Samuel 15-19, Revelation 22:17

# **Discussion Questions**

# DISCOVER

**LEADERS:** Ask someone to read Psalm 63 and use the guestions as a guide for discussion.

- What did Pastor Cam share about the context of Psalm 63? (This psalm was written while David was in the wilderness, on the run from his son Absalom who wanted to kill him. While in these desert seasons, he strengthened himself in the truth.)
- Recall a time when you were in a spiritual wilderness. What did you find yourself reaching for to satisfy your thirst? (David shares in Psalm 63:1 that in the wilderness, his soul thirsted for God. God's presence in the wilderness is better than delivery from the wilderness. Everyone, including Jesus, goes through the wilderness, but not everybody's wilderness looks and feels the same. Instead of seeking out rich food, Pastor Cam shared that we reach for "hurricane snacks." The reality is when all you have is God you realize all you need is God.)
- Anything we reach for in times of crisis is our functional savior, and anything that isn't God is an idol.
   What's the difference between having an idol and an idol having you? (Idols are false gods that
   overpromise and underdeliver. Whether in seasons of crisis or not, idols can be good things that
   become god things. You can recognize an idol when you are willing to sin to get it, and/or if you are
   willing to sin if you don't get it.)
- What leads you to be part of a disciple group? (A few weeks ago, Pastor Joby shared that corporate worship and the gathering of believers is a gift to us to help sustain our faith in the wilderness. A disciple group is another way to gather with believers. LEADERS share: We are so glad that you choose to be part of our group within the Body of Christ and we want to support you as you deepen your relationship with Jesus in and out of the wilderness.)

#### DEEPEN

- Do you see the Gospel as merely practical, or do you see Jesus as beautiful and soul-satisfying? (To some, Jesus is useful. To believers, Jesus is beautiful. Sometimes we are travel agents selling tickets to places we've never been. The Gospel offers us so much more than religious belief systems (and moral guidelines) that don't end in hell. The Gospel offers a beautiful journey of discovering and deepening a relationship with Jesus.)
- What are you willing to blot out so you can gaze on the splendor, joy, and beauty of Jesus?

# **ACTION STEP**

A Disciple...Loves All People, Discovers Identity in Jesus, Deepens Relationship with Jesus.


#### This Week:
