# Upside Down Kingdom - Thy Kingdom Come

**The Point:** "Enemy-occupied territory---that is what this world is. Christianity is the story of how the rightful king has landed, you might say landed in disguise, and is calling us to take part in a great campaign of sabotage" – C.S. Lewis.

SERMON TEXT: Genesis 1:1-2, 26-28, 31; 2:7,18; 3:1-7; 1 John 2:15-17; John 4:30-31, 17:14-18, 18:33-37; Luke 4:3-8; Ephesians 2:1-10, 6:12; Colossians 1:13-14, 2:6-15; 1 Peter 2:9-12; Revelation 21:1-17

# **Discussion Questions**

### **DISCOVER**

Have someone read Genesis 1:1-2, 26-28, 31, 2:15-18, 3:1-7

- How does Genesis 1-3 reveal the emergence of two kingdoms? (God created a good place that was
  corrupted. Man was created to work and keep, to subdue and cultivate, and be fruitful and multiply. Sin
  enters the world and causes man to question the word of God, the worth of God, and the work of God.
  Pastor Joby shared that God allows this to maximize His own glory and because Love is worth the risk).
- How are the values and systems of this world different than the values and systems of God's kingdom? (The kingdom of the air wants us to put faith in broken people leading broken systems verses in the goodness and provision of God. We don't bow down to the donkey or the elephant but rather the Lion who is the lamb of God).

Have someone read Luke 4:3-8 and Ephesians 2:1-10

• Pastor Joby shared that Christians can respond to the tension with both kingdoms in 3 ways: by Fleeing, by Following, or by Fighting. What has God provided us to fight back against this sinstained world? (Many Christian communities FLEE by creating copies of what's in the world that are exclusive and separate, and there are Christian communities that FOLLOW by taking what exists and call it good instead of aligning with God's word. We as Christians are called to fight and have tools in Ephesians 6, Colossians 2, 1 Peter 2. Through Christ Jesus' life, death and resurrection we are offered a change in citizenship and the opportunity to fight back. What we can't do is to try flee the world or follow it!)

# **DEEPEN**

In light of what we have discovered through God's word and discussed above, let's go deeper and discuss how God's word applies to us and our lives.

**LEADERS:** Have someone read 1 John 2:15-17 and 1 Peter 2:9-12 and then <u>choose one or two</u> of the questions below for your deepen discussion.

- What kingdom are you living for? The Kingdom of God or kingdom of self?
- When you experience conflicts or trials what do you reach for first to soothe you?
- What comforts do you need to lay down in order to deepen your relationship with Jesus?
- What comforts do you need to lay down in order to share the gospel with someone else?
- What does the way you spend your money tell you about who your allegiance is to?

\*Leaders: Tell your group to keep an eye out for these questions across Eleven22 social media platforms to engage with other believers around the world as well as in your group.

A Disciple...Loves All People, Discovers Identity in Jesus, Deepens Relationship with Jesus.


**This Week:** Consider what the Holy Spirit is prompting you to do as a response to the sermon.
